

## Professional Development For Educators

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





<p><b>PDED 598E: Engaging Reluctant Learners</b>, Brian Carroll, Ed.D. <i>Join colleagues for a pair of focused days of analysis and discussion related to serving the educational needs of our “reluctant learners”.</i> Using research and strategies developed by Robert Marzano, Randy Sprick and others, educators will reflect on their definition of engagement and learn how their role can promote learning among those we consider reluctant learners. The outcome of this course is for participants to have developed a plan for “systemic engagement” in their classroom and schools. 1 credit. July 16 &amp; 23, 8am-3pm</p>	\$500
<p><b>PDSP 598B: Storykeepers—Teaching History Through Family Stories</b>, Natalie Kinsey-Warnock, MA., author &amp; storyteller. <i>Family stories are a powerful way to teach social studies content and concepts, as well as research skills. This course will support teachers in understanding how to teach history using family stories and to teach research skills in an authentic manner that engages all students.</i> 2 credits. August 13-16, 8-12:30pm</p>	\$1,000
<p><b>PDSP 598C: Evaluating Student Performance through Formative Assessment</b>, Michael Moriarty, Ed.D. <i>The ultimate goal of formative assessment is simple: to help teachers make decisions about what they are currently doing or what they are going to do next. Using formative assessment helps the teacher decide if and when instructional adjustments need to be made.</i> 1 credit. July 9-11, 8am-12pm</p>	\$500
<p><b>PDTM 598D: Integrating Outdoor Education Across the Content Areas</b>, Jason Bruek, Siskin/Coutts Outdoor Education. <i>Project-based learning and proficiency-based grading require hands-on experience and problems for students to solve. Outdoor education provides myriad opportunities to enhance science, ELA, social studies, art and math curriculum through direct experiences and projects in the natural world. This course will support teachers in understanding how to best integrate outdoor education into their curricula.</i> 2 credits. July 10,12,17 &amp; 19, 3-7pm, July 21, 8am-3pm</p>	\$1,000
