Thursday, April 17th - 10am-12N <u>Earth Day Celebration</u>

Celebrate **Earth Day** with us! Join us for this day of repurposing, recycling and reusing as our ancestors did naturally. Explore the famous saying -" Use it up, wear it out, make it do and do without". Make junk art sculptures from our gathered and clean materials, explore natural dying with some egg decorating. Stay for lunch. Join us for a trash pick-up walk about the historic village. Learn a few tidbits of history about the historic buildings during the walk. \$12

Saturday, May 17th - 10:30am to 12N - Beekeeping - Learn fascinating and fun facts about some of the smallest and mightiest residents of our village grounds. Basics of the art of keeping bees will be shared by our resident beekeeper Garret Thibault. Learn about the equipment, try on a bee suit and meet some of our bees at our observation hive. \$12

Saturday, May 17th - 1pm to 2:30pm - Pond Dipping and Exploring at the Lawrence Barn. Explore our pond habitat with nets, sketch books and binoculars. Use our field guides and gain some naturalist skills from our staff. (Drop-in by donation)

Tuesday, May 20th -10:30am-12:30pm Pond Studies - Explore the pond behind the Lawrence Barn with nets, binoculars and field guides. Learn the basics of the pond ecosystem and learn who depends on who. Are you a part of that picture?. Take a close look at the animals that live in and around the pond and how the health of this habitat is a measure of water quality and also a source of joy and artistic exploration. \$12

Join Hilary Rosa, Food Access Coordinator, from Green Mountain Farm to School for our rhubarb extravaganza class. Head over to the Eaton House to harvest rhubarb from our historic village patch. We will then go back to the Grammar School and make rhubarb pie and a freezer jam to take home. Wednesday, June 18th, 10:30am-12:30pm Weed Walkers/Trailside

Gawkers Historically, some of our common weeds were used as natural remedies and have useful qualities. Participants will go on a "weed walk" around the historic village and recreation trail and learn historical tidbits and a wide range of uses (dyes, medicine, food, pollution abatement) of the common plants that we see every day. A fun class to connect with the ordinary plants in our lives, learn a bit of botany and begin a habit of close nature observation. We will also do a hands-on project related to the plants we observe on the museum grounds. \$12
